Maryland Tourism Day Event Draws Record Crowd

February 14 was Maryland Tourism Day. The event was held at Rams Head on Stage and garnered a record-breaking crowd of nearly 250 tourism professionals who gathered in Annapolis to make the case for tourism's vital role in Maryland's economy. During the event, Maryland Secretary of Agriculture Kevin Atticks was on hand to accept the Tourism Person of the Year award and Delegate Wayne Hartman was recognized for being named the Tourism Advocate of the Year award (the awards were announced at the November 2024 Maryland Tourism & Travel Summit in Belcamp). In addition, several luminaries offered remarks, including Maryland Tourism Development Board Chairman Ben Seidel. Quinn Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church Awarded Funding from the National Trust for Historic Preservation

Quinn Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Frederick has received funding from the African American Cultural Heritage Action Fund at the National Trust for Historic Preservation as one of its 2025 Preserving Black Churches program cohort. This year, 30 historically Black Churches across the United States will receive a collective \$8.5 million in funding to support critical preservation work from structural restoration work to enhancing stewardship planning. Quinn Chapel served as an Underground Railroad safehouse, a Civil War-era hospital, a school for Black children, and a center of educational and social activism. The building was originally constructed in 1819 and has undergone several additions over 200 years. Funding will support the restoration of the building's bell tower, constructed in 1923. Maryland Delegation Attends American Bus Association Marketplace

From February 1-4, OTD's Travel Trade Manager Rich Gilbert and Destination Development Manager Lisa Hansen Terhune joined a large Maryland delegation attending the American Bus Association Marketplace (ABA) in Philadelphia. Gilbert and Terhune met with more than 100 tour operators during 7-minute appointment sessions during the event. Membership in ABA includes motorcoach operators, tour operators, tourism-related organizations, and products and service suppliers. This year's event was the largest in recent years with more than 3,400 attendees.

During this year's Marketplace Rich Gilbert received the Wayne Chandler "Spirit of Partnership Award." The award recognizes an individual who creatively works within the group travel industry to build partnerships to promote all tourism market segments and destinations.
