OTD Managing Director Liz Fltzsimmons Presents at Maryland Association of Counties (MACo) Winter Conference



On December 11, OTD Managing Director Liz Fitzsimmons participated in a panel at MACo's Winter Conference in Cambridge. The panel was convened to highlight the vital role of Maryland's DMOs in the state's economic growth. Fitzsimmons discussed the top five differentiators for tourism in Maryland: Maryland's Underground Railroad sites, the Great Chesapeake Bay Loop and Beaches, Maryland's Trail System, our Scenic Byways, and Fish & Hunt Maryland. She emphasized that these differentiators not only attract visitors, but also serve to preserve the state's rich history and natural beauty. Fitzsimmons also highlighted the fact that in 2023, Maryland welcomed 45.1 million visitors who spent \$20.5 billion, proving tourism's significant impact on the state's economy.
